# Those darned pests!

We all hear them. There are coyotes in the area, and it's only natural. Coyotes live in wooded areas and follow deer along the river. Some good advice from the Department of Conservation.

The bulk of the coyote diet consists of small mammals, insects, carrion, and wild fruits. However, coyotes sometimes kill small animals, including pets. So keep your furry friends inside at night and in enclosed areas. For more check the department website: https://mdc.mo.gov/wildlife/nuisance-problem-species/nuisance-native-species/coyote-control

While it is legal to trap coyotes with proper permit, it's easy to keep them at bay. Coyotes are frightened by loud noise. The City of Herculaneum points residents to the Bi-State Wildlife Hotline, which suggests beating pans, using air horns and other noise-making devices.

Stonewater trustees advise against more radical methods such as explosives and gunfire. Please don't. There are safer ways to frighten coyotes ... and your neighbors.

Wild animals were here long before the subdivision, and it's best to scare them away.
